ALL DEPARTMENT MAJORS

The department offers a Bachelor of Arts degree in Slavic Languages and Literatures.

Students select one of the following options within the major:

RUSSIAN language, literature, and culture
or EAST EUROPEAN languages, literatures, and cultures

The following applies to all MAJORS completing their BA in the Slavic Department:

- Students in good academic standing may declare the major at any time
- All courses presented for the major (UW and transfer) must be taken for a numerical grade
- A minimum grade of 2.0 must be earned for each course (UW and transfer) presented for the major
- Students maintain a minimum 2.50 "departmental" GPA for all major courses (UW and transfer)
- Students must complete a minimum of 50 credits of coursework (UW and transfer) toward their major
(1st- and 2nd-year Russian language courses do not count and are considered preparatory and only one 100-level lit and culture course may count toward the major.)
- Students placing into an advanced level of language do not waive the 50-credit minimum requirement
- Transfer students: a minimum of 15 graded credits presented for this major must be completed at the UW
- Study Abroad coursework is considered to be UW coursework and may apply to the major if UW Credit Evaluation forms have been filed with the adviser in advance of departure and are evaluated upon return to the UW

ALL DEPARTMENT MINORS

The department offers three minors:
RUSSIAN language
SLAVIC languages
RUSSIAN literatures and SLAVIC literatures

The following applies to all students completing a MINOR in the Slavic Department:

- Students in good academic standing may declare the minor after reaching junior standing (90 credits)
- All courses presented for the minor (UW and transfer) must be taken for a numerical grade
- A minimum grade of 2.0 must be earned for each course (UW and transfer) presented for the minor
- Students must complete a minimum of 25 credits of coursework (UW and transfer) toward their minor
(1st- and 2nd-year Russian language courses and 100-level lit and culture courses do not count and are considered preparatory)
- Students placing into an advanced level of language do not waive the 25-credit minimum requirement
- Transfer students: a minimum of 15 graded credits presented for this minor must be completed at the UW
- Study Abroad coursework is considered to be UW coursework and may apply to the minor if UW Credit Evaluation forms have been filed with the adviser in advance of departure and are evaluated upon return
